Grades Don't Improve Under Stress, Clarity Does

As the end-semester examinations approach, a noticeable rise in anxiety can be observed across campus. While academic pressure is an inevitable part of student life, excessive stress often becomes counterproductive. Instead of enhancing performance, it can significantly impair a student's ability to recall information, concentrate during long study hours, and think critically in the examination hall.

Studies have consistently shown that high stress levels interfere with cognitive functioning. When the mind is overwhelmed, it tends to shift into a "fight or flight" mode, causing memory lapses, reduced focus, and erratic decision-making. For students, this means that even well-prepared subjects may appear confusing during exams simply because the mind is fatigued.

Maintaining emotional and mental balance is therefore essential. Structured preparation, timely breaks, adequate sleep, and limiting distractions have been proven to improve retention and understanding. A calm mind is more receptive, more analytical, and better equipped to handle

exam pressure.

Ms Nutan Kanth, Senior Psychologist and Counsellor, explained that most stress begins with overthinking, which often develops from fear especially when students feel they have missed something. She emphasized that focusing on what is still doable and choosing to be a doer rather than a thinker helps break this cycle. She added that peers usually notice stress early, and open conversation and support can greatly reduce anxiety.

Equally important is avoiding unnecessary comparison with peers. Every student has a different learning pace, and constant comparison often leads to self-doubt rather than improvement. Approaching the exam season

with a composed mindset not only enhances performance but also protects long-term well-being.

According to Associate Professor, Dr Anu Dandona, "Stress is a natural response to pressure that can affect both mind and body." She highlights that simple strategies like deep breathing, time management, and positive self-talk help us handle challenges with greater confidence.

Examinations are a measure of academic readiness, not a reflection of personal worth. As the semester draws to a close, prioritising mental clarity may be the most effective strategy for achieving meaningful results. ■

A standout moment of the event was the interactive "Life

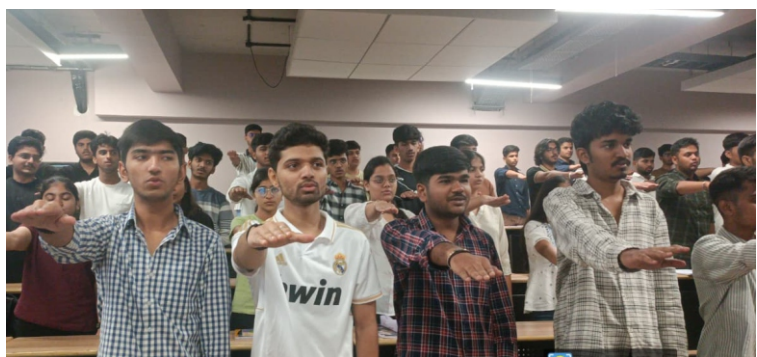

Sandeep Dongare, an Assistant Professor in the School of Media & Journalism at DYPIU has been selected for the prestigious international course "Film Preservation and Restoration Workshop India", jointly organised by the International Federation of Film Archives (FIAF), Belgium, and the Film Heritage Foundation (FHF), India, with the collaboration of the Government of Odisha.

THIS year marks the 10th edition of the workshop. Mr Dongare was selected for Prestigious International Film Preservation Programme.

The workshop was held at Kala Bhumi Crafts Museum, Bhuvaneshwar, Odisha from 12th November to 19th November, 2025.

This intensive training programme focuses on the cultural and historical importance of film and audio-visual material, film preservation techniques, restoration processes, digitisation of film, and case studies of national and international film conservation.

World-class experts from across the globe conducted the training sessions. Only 60 participants from India are selected for this prestigious workshop each year. Indian cinema is an invaluable part of the nation's cultural and historical heritage, and its preservation is crucial.

The Film Heritage Foundation, India—supported by FIAF—has been conducting this course for the past 10 years in part-

nership with the Central and State Governments. The programme's brand ambassador is Amitabh Bachchan, and several renowned Indian filmmakers and scholars are associated with it.

Earlier, Mr Dongare was also selected for the Film Research Fellowship at the Satyajit Ray Film and Television Institute (SRFTI), Kolkata, where he presented research paper on the film posters created by Solapur-based Yalla Dasi. He continues to work extensively on Indian cinema, film history, and contemporary cinematic studies.

This new selection marks an important milestone in his research journey and will enable him to contribute meaningfully to the field of film preservation and restoration in the future. He believes that preserving the precious legacy of Indian cinema is critically important, especially in today's digital and AI-driven era. He has been consistently working towards creating awareness and conducting research in this domain for many years.

Dr. Vaishali C. Kulloli Defends her Ph.D



Dr. Vaishali C. Kulloli has defended her Ph.D. (Computer Science and Engineering) Viva Voce exam on 17/11/25 under the Guidance of Dr. Maheshwari Biradar.

Her Ph.D topic was "Iris Liveness Detection using quality metrics for Biometric Authentication".

She has implemented Machine Learning, Deep Learning Algorithms, performed Iris Video Reply attack detection and created 115 Real Iris Video Dataset and 115 Fake Iris Video Dataset. ■

Global Recognition for Outstanding Scientific Contributions: Karmaveer Chakra Medal and Rex Karmaveer Global Fellowship Awarded to Professor Ramendra Pati Pandey.

Professor Ramendra Pati Pandey, Deputy Dean (R&D), and In-Charge Director of the School of Biosciences and Bioengineering, has been selected to receive the esteemed Karmaveer Chakra Award 2025-26 and the Rex Karmaveer Global Fellowship for his exceptional contributions to scientific research. The award is instituted by iCONGO in partnership with the United Nations (UN).

The Rex Karmaveer Chakra Awards celebrate real-life heroes who embody the spirit of 'Be the Change.' These awards spotlight individuals who take bold, innovative paths to inspire and bring about meaningful change. All the awardees are dubbed Noble Laureates. The award is a tribute to the former honorable president of India, Dr. A.P.J. Abdul Kalam, who had offered to be the ambassador for the awards.

Dr. Pandey has been very actively engaged in promising studies in basic and mycobacterial immunology. His work has shown for the first time that Foxo1 acts as a key transcription factor in the biology of Th9 and IL-9-producing T cells: Foxo1 was required for the induction of IL-9 with concomitant suppression of IL-17; inhibition of AKT enhanced the Foxo1-mediated development of Th9 cells. Given the proinflammatory functions of Th9 cells in allergic inflammation, autoimmunity, and tumor immunity, the identification of Foxo1 as a key transcription factor that dictates the development and effector functions of Th9 and IL-9-producing T cells could prove beneficial in designing targeted therapies aimed at alleviating the course of autoimmune diseases and anti-cancer therapy.

Professor Ramendra Pati Pandey has also been honoured with the NESAFellowship of the Year Award 2025.

The National Environmental Science Academy (NESA), one of the prominent academies in the country with its headquarters in New Delhi, has selected Prof. Ramendra Pati Pandey for the NESAFellowship of the Year Award 2025 for his contribution to the health science research. ■
